KATE SCOTT AITKEN

1891 - 1971

Born in Beeton and taught school here. Helped organize Beeton Women's Institute and was first president 1920. After marriage, operated a canning business at her home, Appledell. Published many newspaper articles and books including a cook book, book of etiquette and "Never a Day so Bright" about life in Beeton.

"Mrs. A." was Women's Director, Canadian National Exhibition for fourteen years; Women's Editor of the Montreal Standard; and a radio broadcaster for twenty-three years. A world traveller, she logged over two million miles.
