SIR FREDERICK BANTING SECONDARY SCHOOL

In the field of medical science, the name of Frederick Grant Banting has earned the gratitude of multitudes of people.

Born in Alliston, Ontario, 14 November 1891, he received his professional training in Toronto. Following World War I, he practised medicine in this city until May 1921. He then moved to Toronto where with his colleague, Charles H. Best, the basic research that led to the discovery of insulin as a treatment for diabetes was carried out. This achievement won for him and his fellow researcher a Nobel award for an outstanding contribution to medical science.

Out of his varied interests grew the Banting Research Foundation and later the Banting Institute, both of which continue to make major contributions to medical science internationally as well as nationally.

In 1934, Dr. Banting was made a Knight of the British Empire. Unfortunately, his brilliant service to mankind was abruptly cut short by his untimely death in an airplane accident in Newfoundland on 21 February 1941, while serving his country as Correlator of Aviation Medical Research for the Canadian and British forces.

This impressive school, dedicated to the memory of one of Canada's most illustrious medical scientists, embodies many of the most up-to-date concepts related to secondary school education.

Located on a twenty-two-acre site, the building has been constructed to serve as the centre of an educational and recreational complex in a rapidly developing section of the City.

This school, with accommodation for approximately 1700 students when fully occupied, offers courses in the academic, commercial and technical fields. Its facilities have been designed to achieve the maximum of flexibility and to provide for the utilization of the most up-to-date methods of classroom instruction.
