Education

Education opportunities abound in New Tecumseth for children, youth and adults alike. A total of 12 publicly funded elementary schools and one Christian school lie within the town's boundaries and provide elementary education from junior kindergarten to grade eight. Two secondary schools provide a wide variety of programs in Arts, Science and Technology, leading to an Ontario Secondary School Graduation Diploma.

Thirteen tertiary level institutions (Colleges and Universities) which provide post secondary graduate and post-graduate degrees and diploma's are all within easy driving distance of New Tecumseth. One of these institutions, Georgian College of Applied Arts and Technology, is situated only 40 kilometers from the Town and provides courses in nursing, business, technology, tourism and hospitality, and is the home of the internationally renowned Canadian Automotive Institute.

Religion

The Town of New Tecumseth is served by congregations of many different faiths, with a strong active ministerial association. Century old Christian churches as well as modern places of worship are located in the town and immediate area.

Pre-School

Pre-school care is provided by four full time day care centres in the Town of New Tecumseth. There is a cooperative half day program, two family resource centres and many local play groups.

Banking

New Tecumseth... Municipal Government and Services

Government

The Town of New Tecumseth is governed by a council consisting of a mayor, deputy mayor and seven ward councillors, elected for three year terms. The municipal staff is administered by a town manager/clerk.

Planning and Development

New Tecumseth has a recentlyapproved 1995 Official Plan and 1996 Comprehensive Zoning By-Law which identify several areas for commercial and industrial expansion with infrastructure and servicing capability. Planning and approval of industrial and residential development is ongoing.

Public Works/Public Utilities

The town has full sewage and water servicing capability in the three urban areas. New Tecumseth operates a full blue box recycling program in cooperation with the county. The town has a waste management program and works together with the County of Simcoe and private handlers to collect and dispose of waste.



Police Protection

Policing is carried out by the Ontario Provincial Police under contract. The O.P.P. provides full 24hour protection with a staff of 27.

Fire Protection

The New Tecumseth Fire Department with 100 volunteer firefighters is housed in three modern fire stations. Each has a full complement of pumpers, tankers, rescue vehicles and the latest in extrication equipment. The Town welcomes inquiries:

New Tecumseth... Medical and Emergency Services





Stevenson Memorial Hospital

The original Stevenson Memorial Hospital, built in 1928, served the Alliston and New Tecumseth community until 1964. The present 43 bed hospital, constructed in 1964, has medical, surgical, pediatric, obstetrical and day surgery units including a Special Care Unit of four beds to provide extra service and supervision for continuous care. There are also several outpatient clinics, (e.g., dermatology, speech therapy, diet counselling, otolaryngology, audiology, pediatrics, orthopedics, general surgery and internal medicine) as well as x-ray, ultrasound, mammography, laboratory, physiotherapy, palliative care, dialysis, pharmacy, mental health, ambulance (land and heliport), emergency and surgical procedures serving both inpatients and outpatients.

All departments have qualified, registered personnel to ensure professional service to all patients. About 20 Family Practitioners, an Obstetrician, a General Internist, along with visiting specialists, provide care to the community.

The hospital auxiliary is very active in Stevenson Memorial Hospital. The hospital is accredited by the Canadian Council on Health Facilities Accreditation.

Simcoe County Health Unit

There is a branch of the Simcoe County District Health Unit in the area. Public health inspectors and nurses, and dental health staff, offer a wide range of health services focused on promoting health and preventing disease, illness and injury.

Home Care

Community Care Access Centre provides home care in the community. Various support services such as Meals on Wheels, V.O.N. and Red Cross programs are also available in New Tecumseth.

Other Services

Other clinics include medical doctors, dentists, optometrists, chiropractic practitioners, massage therapists, physiotherapists.

Nursing homes and retirement homes are also located in the Town of New Tecumseth.

Labour Profile*

The work force in New Tecumseth consists of the labour pool living within the boundaries of the Town as well as the surrounding area. There are approximately 281,000 people living within 60 km. of New Tecumseth. There is an employment rate of about 93.5 per cent in the district which is approximately 3% above the national average. Most Human Resources Development Canada services are provided by New Tecumseth Employment Services, located in Alliston.

Transportation Railroads

The main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway between Toronto and Vancouver passes through New Tecumseth. Several manufacturers have working sidings. The Vaughan Intermodal Terminal is in close proximity to the Town.

Road transportation

New Tecumseth is well served by transport companies. Service is available for local and international handling.

Airports

Lester B. Pearson International Airport is approximately 64 km (40 miles) south of New Tecumseth, serving the area with domestic and international flights. Several privately owned air strips are located in the vicinity.

Highways

Highways 9 and 89 give easy access to Highways 50 and 400. County and town roads provide local service.

Waterways

The Great Lakes and the St. Lawrence Seaway are within 56 kms (35 miles) for water shipments.

Buses

Bus service makes for easy accessibility to all parts of Canada and the United States. Chartered bus facilities are also available.

Customs

Bonded warehousing and custom clearing are available in the area.

New Tecumseth... Tourism

Tourism continues to thrive in New Tecumseth... as a destination point for a vacation and a location in which to establish a tourist related business.

Accommodation

The Nottawasaga Inn, has gained world recognition for its quality service including excellent conference and banquet facilities, 3 restaurants, recreation centre, golf course and much more in a riverside country setting. The Red Pine Motor Inn and Conference Centre has modern rooms, recreation centre, meeting rooms, restaurant facilities for the business or family traveller.

There are bed and breakfast facilities most of which are in country settings. Several are located in the urban centre of Tottenham. Some are on working farms and make a total holiday by themselves.

Camp grounds are open from early May for the summer months. Earl Rowe Provincial Park borders the north west boundary of the town, Tottenham Conservation Area is located in the southern part of the town while several privatelyowned camping facilities are also located in and near New Tecumseth.

Details of the accommodation facilities and local attractions are available through the tourist information offices of the Alliston or Tottenham chambers of commerce.

Golf

There are three golf courses within the town, Nottawasaga Inn, Ponderosa, and Woodington Lake. Bear Creek, Green Acres, Lake Simcoe, Big Cedar, Scotch Settlement, Royal Downs and National Pines are all within a short drive.











Skiing

Downhill skiing is available at six public areas - Loretto, Hockley Valley, Snow Valley, Horseshoe, Mount St. Louis/Moonstone and Blue Mountain and at private ski clubs ranging from Mansfield Ski Club to a number of clubs in the Collingwood area.

If you can tear yourself away from New Tecumseth and our local hospitality, you will find that you are only a short distance away from all of southern Ontario's major events and attractions.

New Tecumseth... Lifestyle, Culture and Climate



Lifestyles and Culture

Many recreational activities are available within the Town of New Tecumseth. Three community centres provide arenas with artificial ice as well as community halls with banquet facilities.

Tennis courts, parks, conservation areas, baseball diamonds, soccer fields, outdoor (summer) swimming pool, cinema, bowling alley and curling clubs are located within the municipality. Cross country and downhill skiing, tobogganning, snowmobiling, boating, flying, golfing, camping and swimming are available in the town or in the nearby surrounding areas.

New Tecumseths' Parks, Recreation & Culture Department offers varied programs for children and adults throughout the year, as well as specialty camps during the summer.

Pioneer life and the history of the area are well preserved in the South Simcoe Pioneer Museum located in Alliston's Riverdale Park. Also in the park is a log cabin, built in 1850, donated by the Salada Shiriff Horsey Company and moved to the museum site in 1960 and a Century Barn which was raised in 1991. Changing themes, together with special events including Canada Day activities

and Community Exhibit Displays, make each visit to the museum a fascinating experience.

Tottenham Conservation Area is located just west of Tottenham. This idyllic spot boasts 41 acres of prime parkland overlooking a pond. Walking trails, camping facilities, fishing, swimming, canoeing, nature trails and two covered pavilions are available to visitors.

Earl Rowe Provincial Park located just west of Alliston is 900 acres of recreational playground, outdoor pool, man-made lake, fishing and canoeing. Camping facilities have complete hookups or primitive sites.

Cultural and social groups, service clubs, associations, and sports-oriented organizations flourish throughout New Tecumseth.

The New Tecumseth Arts Council works to foster the cultural enrichment of the area by developing a widespread appreciation of, support for and involvement with the arts.

New Tecumseth Public Library is a neighbourhood library with branches in Alliston, Beeton and Tottenham. The library provides a variety of programs, exhibits and materials to meet the educational and recreational information needs of all ages.


Climate

Lying to the east of the Niagara Escarpment and about 50 km inland from Georgian Bay, New Tecumseth enjoys a more moderate climate with less snowfall than most of its neighbours to the north or west. Temperatures are noticeably milder and as a result, black walnut, English Ivy, and mulberry, tulip trees, catalpa, even magnolia can be found thriving in the town.

New Tecumseth... Energy Sources

Electricity

In New Tecumseth the majority of the electricity supply is provided by the New Tecumseth Hydro Electric Commission. Bulk power is purchased wholesale from Ontario Hydro at 44,000 volts. Eight substations owned by New Tecumseth Hydro transform this voltage down to three primary voltages of either 4160, 8320, or 13,800 volts, with a current total rated capacity of 42,500 KVA. Distribution transformers further transform the primary voltages to a customer utilization AC voltage of either 600/347 (3 phase), 120/208 (3 phase) or 120/240 (1 phase).

Note: When a customer supplies their own transformation, which they must do if their demand is greater than 500 KVA, they may have any voltage they wish on the secondary side, but they must purchase their primary supply at 4,000 volts from the New Tecumseth Hydro Electric Commission.
